

VI. REPORT FROM TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS

A. SUPERVISOR

Supervisor Hickey reported that that the Village has received the paperwork and drawings for the proposed Food Pantry expansion and is set for the Agenda on July 9, 2015.

It is planned to be able to gather bids by August.

Maplewood has 5 dead trees and 3 of them are quite large. All will need to be removed.

The fence for Maplewood is now complete; however the transom isn't completed yet. The fence paint issue for Marshall Cemetery is still under discussion with the paint supplier and the fence supplier.

B. TRUSTEES

1. Trustee Boban

Trustee Boban reported the Annual Clean up day resulted in over 25,000 lbs of electronics collected. While there is talk of cut backs from the state, the County has indicated they are interested in continuing to support the Township's efforts.

There is a proposed 5.5% increase for the next 2 (two) years. Trustee Boban is also suggested the Township request a separate container to hold latex paint that is ready to be picked up.

2. Trustee Kaupas

Trustee Kaupas reported that Triad presented a seminar called "Who is Knocking At Your Door" where explanations were given for which uniforms belonged to which services and how to ask for ID.

The Foundation is researching grant possibilities.

3. Trustee Wennlund

4. Trustee Medema

Trustee Medema reported that he had taped a public service announcement for Channel 6.

C. CLERK

D. HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER

Highway Commissioner McPartlin that 2 blacktop projects were already completed, including Calmer, Lancaster, Hempstead, Walona, Charlotte Ct, Maray, Second Avenue, and Garfield, completed by Gallagher Asphalt. North Anderson, Harmonie, Redwood, Barbara Lane, were completed by P.T. Ferro. Commissioner McPartlin is preparing to begin another \$400,000 in blacktop projects.

Highway Commissioner McPartlin also reported that the Township Highway Department also passed a Prevailing Wage Ordinance today.

E. ASSESSOR

Assessor Hernandez reported that there will be an approximate 1.25% increase in the assessments which represents the first increase since 2008. This year is also the quadrennial assessment process.
